Workshop Title

More Than a Job: Finding Joy in Work Through Purpose, Value and Service

Workshop Description

Joy in work comes from a simple equation: on one side is the individual—their gifts, perspectives, and attitude. On the other side is the workplace—the environment, culture, and systems that allow people to flourish. When these two sides are in balance, organizations achieve their goals, strengthen stakeholder relationships, and spark innovation and productivity.

This workshop, inspired by the story of "Aunty Peggy," a custodian who found deep pride and meaning in her work, explores the three essential elements that create joy at work: **Purpose, Value, and Service**. Participants will examine how these elements can be intentionally cultivated—both individually and organizationally—to foster engagement, resilience, and a positive workplace culture.

Through reflection, discussion, and practical strategies, participants will learn how to "work both sides of the equation" to create environments where employees are energized, respected, and connected to the people they serve.

Learning Objectives

By the end of this session, participants will be able to:

- Define the three core components of joy in work—Purpose, Value, and Service—and explain their impact on individual and organizational success.
- Assess their own work experience using the "Joy in Work" equation and identify areas for personal and team growth.
- **Apply** practical strategies to foster a workplace environment that supports employee engagement, innovation, and collaboration.

 Develop an action plan to strengthen both individual contribution and organizational culture for sustained workplace joy.
